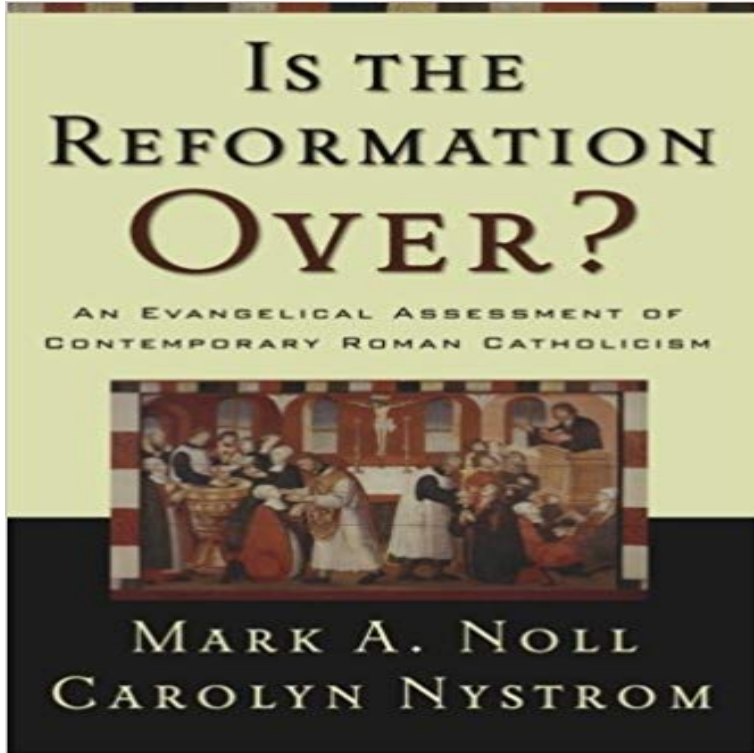


Is the Reformation Over?: An Evangelical Assessment of Contemporary Roman Catholicism
