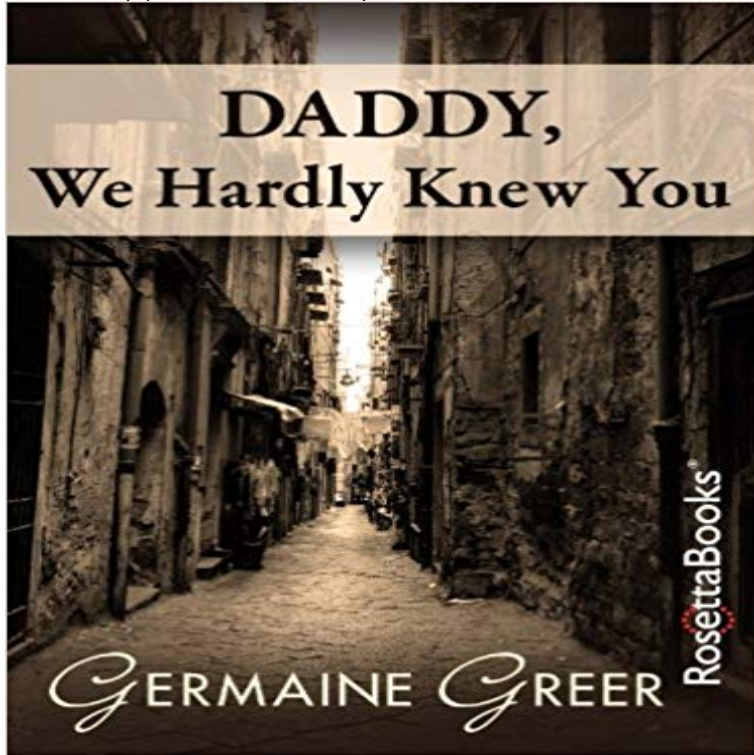


Daddy, We Hardly Knew You

ABOUT THE AUTHOR Germaine Greer is a major Australian feminist writer, academic, and journalist. She is the author of *The Female Eunuch*, an influential feminist work that became an international bestseller in 1970. Her other books include *Sex and Destiny: The Politics of Human Fertility*; *The Whole Woman*; *The Change: Women, Ageing and Menopause*; and *Shakespeare's Wife*. Born in Melbourne in 1939, Greer attended the University of Melbourne and later became involved with the Sydney Push intellectual subculture and the anarchist movement. Later, she became a professor at the University of Sydney and then the University of Warwick and later the University of Tulsa, and earned a Ph.D. from the University of Cambridge. She was the founding editor of the academic journal *Tulsa Studies in Women's Literature*. She has appeared as a commentator on television programs including *William F. Buckley's Firing Line* as well as programming on the RTE, the BBC, and ABC television.
