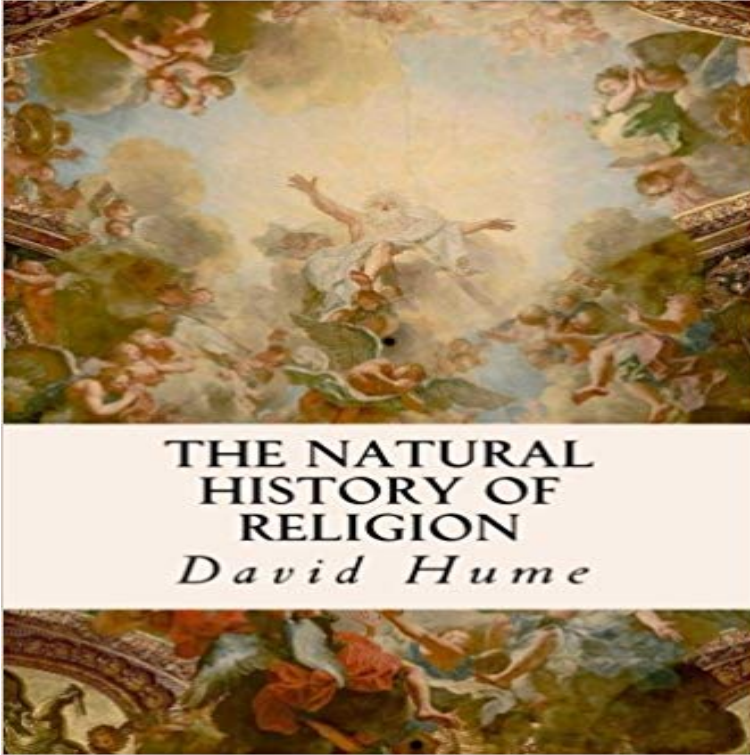


# The Natural History of Religion
