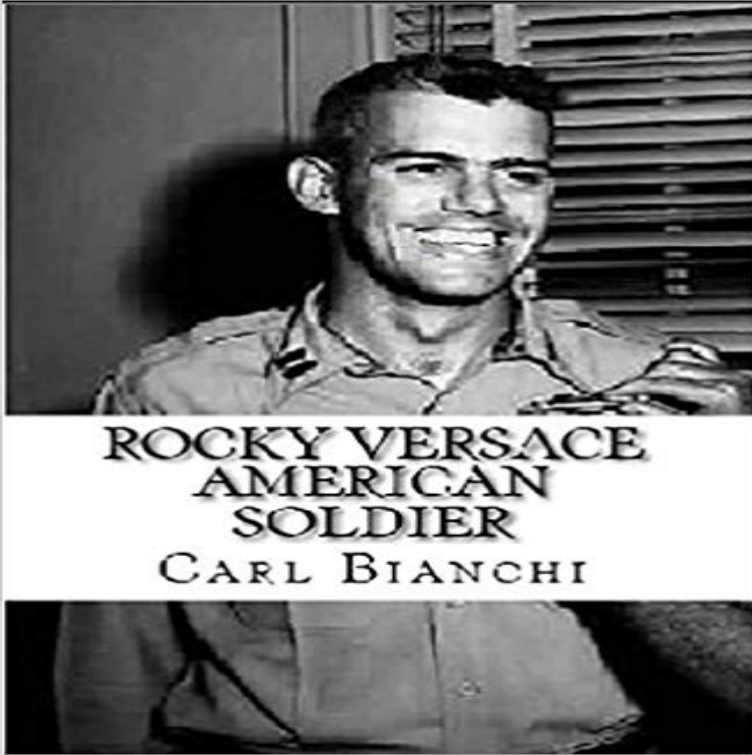


Rocky Versace American Soldier

Humbert Rocky Versace graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, Class of 1959. He was captured in South Vietnam and taken as a Prisoner of War.
