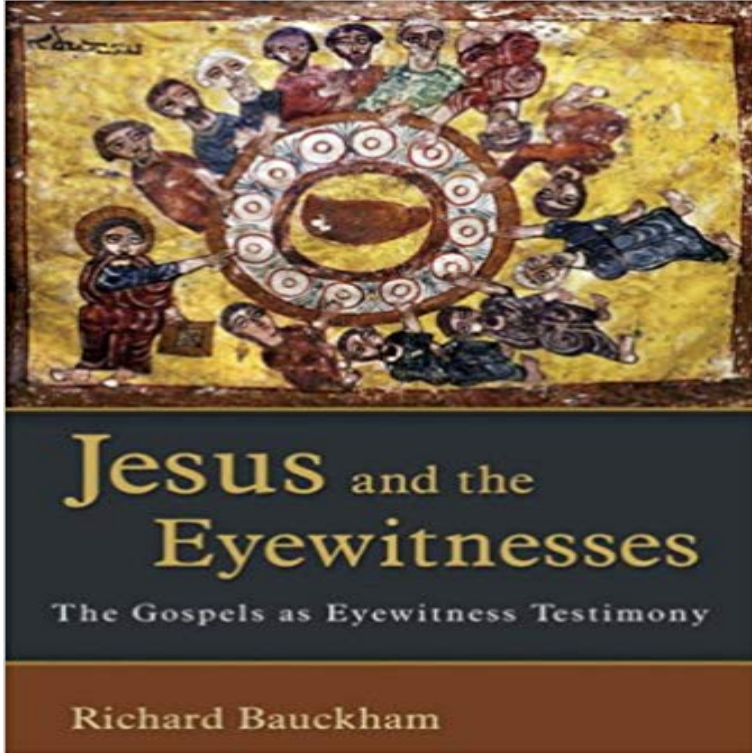


Jesus and the Eyewitnesses: The Gospels as Eyewitness Testimony

The author challenges the assumption that the accounts of Jesus circulated as anonymous community traditions, asserting instead that they were transmitted in the name of the original eyewitnesses. To drive home this controversial point, Bauckham draws on internal literary evidence, the use of personal names in first-century Jewish Palestine, and recent developments in the understanding of oral tradition.
