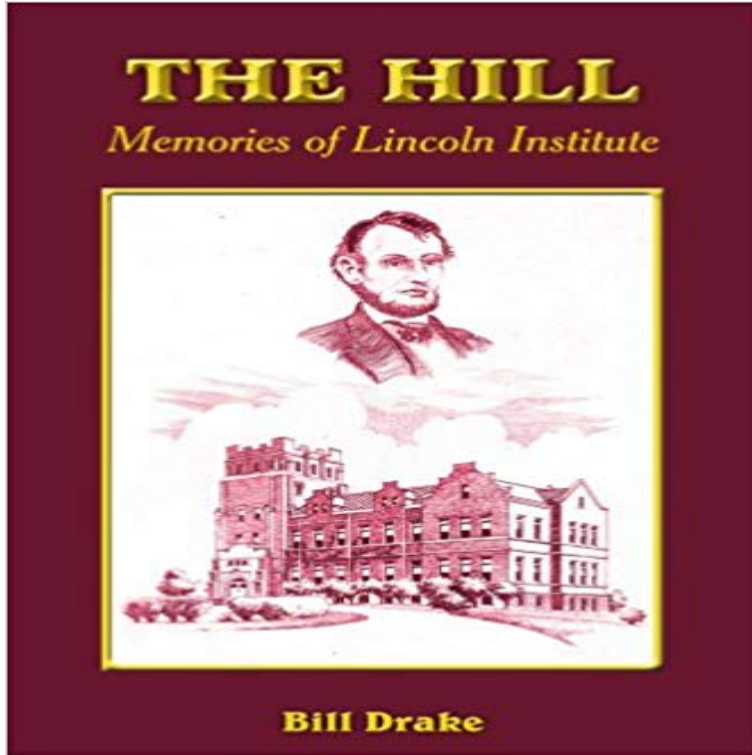


THE HILL: Memories of Lincoln Institute
