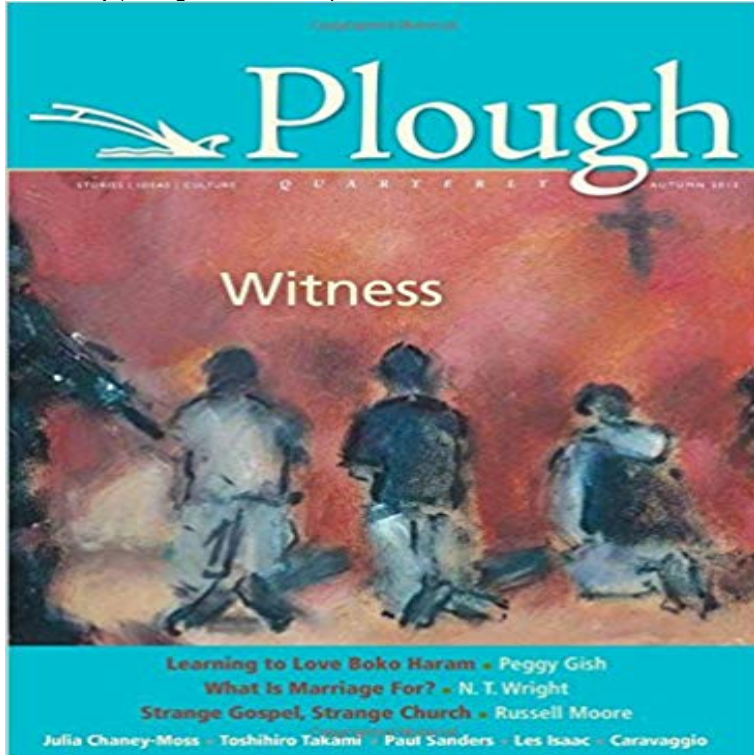


## Plough Quarterly No. 6: Witness
