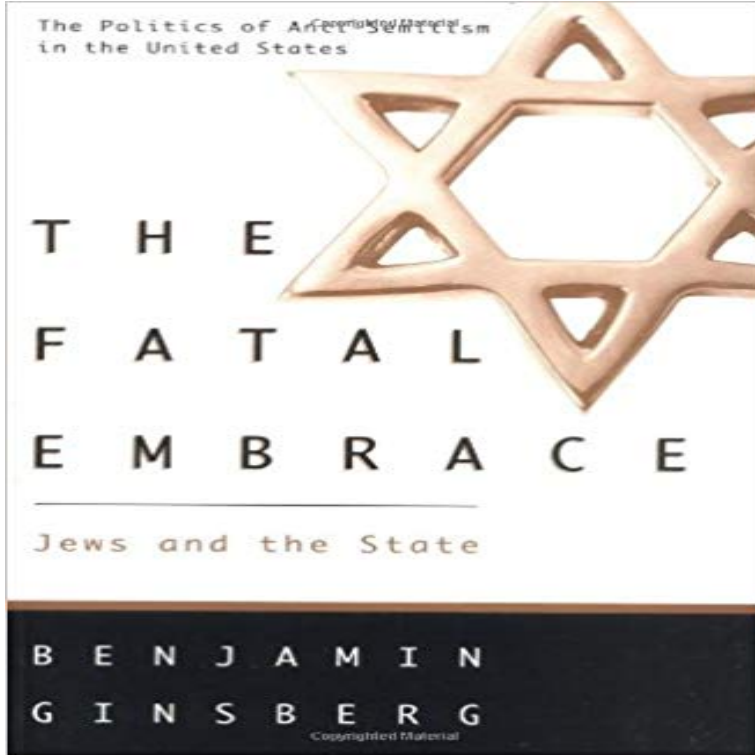


The Fatal Embrace: Jews and the State
