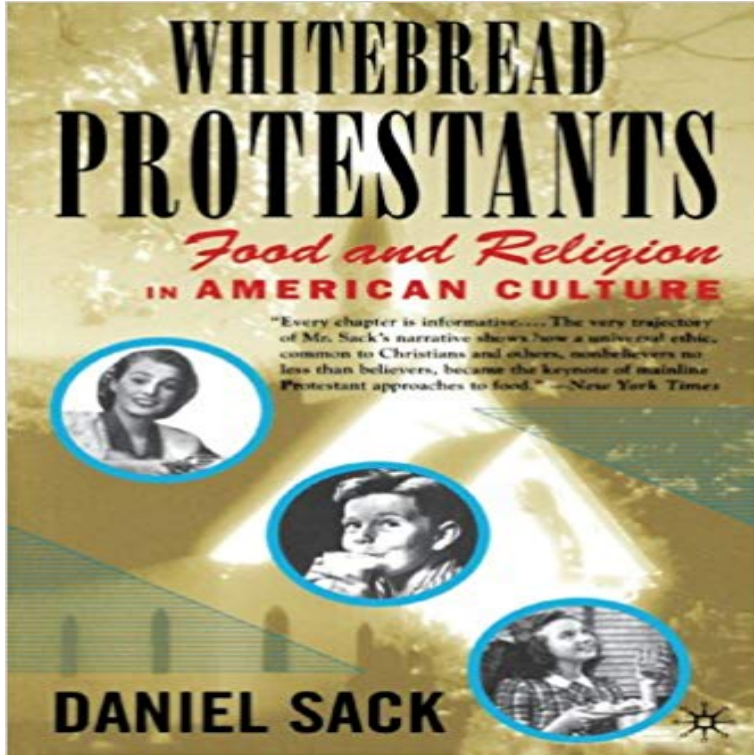


Whitebread Protestants: Food and Religion in American Culture
